I think that everyone knows by now that Frank Daniels died. He was an enthusiastic operator during the HO division operation sessions. He will be missed.

Here are the dates for March, 2011. The regular club Sunday meeting on the first Sunday, March 6 will be an operating session. The third Sunday, March 20 will be a run session, since it is still the regular open house for CMOR. We will start about 1:00. There will be Saturday work sessions on March 12 and 26. Thursday work sessions will be on March 3, 10, 17, 24, and 31 starting at 9:30.

We did operate in February with a small dedicated crew. We ran most of the trains. The CMOR International Fest on Saturday, February 19 was very well attended. Many thanks to all the HO division members who helped with and enjoyed the festival. Thanks to Bob Redlinger, we had two train cameras operating on the layout, and they were very popular. We had a lot of visitors from the Festival. And the third Sunday open house was also well attended by visitors, with a few dedication HO division members operating trains for that.

Work session attendance has improved somewhat in February. With the major CMOR events out of the way, we have been able to start working on some of the projects that have been neglected for the last few months. The narrow gauge ore transfer trestle now has railings on it, and a test showed that the approximately 8 percent grade was a little too steep to push cars up, so we have extended the slope, and the resulting 5 percent grade looks manageable. We are now trying to get that finalized so that we can get track on that.

We have had our usual number of maintenance items that have needed to be addressed, but all in all, the operation of the layout has been fairly good the last few months.

Curt and I are still operating on Tuesday AM, and frequently have been having others join us.

Remember to bring locomotives and controllers for the operating session (which will be March 6), and for the run session which is on the third Sunday, March 20.

I want to start with offer my thanks to the N-Scale members who turned out to support the museums International Fest. The day was pretty much uneventful except for a few complications when some of the members tried running several trains in opposite directions. The need for several more run-arounds was quickly discovered if we are to have successful operating sessions. The large number of members wanting to run trains also pointed out our need to get our operations program underway. With only room for three or four trains to run around our loops, we need to have more opportunities for members to participate. Work towards preparing the layout for operations continues with the installation of three of the five switches required and removal of some of the #1 main line to allow room for additional industrial sidings.

Our support of the International Fest helped to make it a grand success. A record crowd of over 2000 attended.

Work on the new museum offices continues, with the end almost in sight. Doors are in place and the last of the crown molding has been installed and painted. That completes all the painting. All that remains is to sand and refinish the floors. Thanks to all of you who have contributed to this effort.

The museum's Annual Membership Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, March 31st, starting with a volunteer dinner at 6 pm. Prior to that, but connected to it will be a Youth Advisory Council session. The museum has asked if from 5 to 6 pm a representative from our club could speak with the children about model railroading and also give a tour of the club and have the garden railroad operating.

A new book/video check out procedure was also introduced and explained. The internet link and use procedure is also being put on our web page.
